CSU A-G WEIGHTED GRADE POINT AVERAGE: For California State Universities, the college weighted GPA begins in the 10th grade and is based on the A-G requirements. When applying to universities and colleges, each university completes their own calculations, so pay attention to their requirements as they change annually. The GPAs listed on your transcripts are estimates.

COLLEGE ATHLETES: If you are planning to play sports in college, please speak with your counselor regarding the NCAA requirements for Division I, II and III or NAIA. For more information: www.web3.ncaa.org or www.naia.org

COMMUNITY SERVICE: 30 hours of community service are required for graduation. However, if you are interested in attending a four year university, you will need many more hours (100+). Start working on those hours now. Do not procrastinate!! For more information on volunteer opportunities visit volunteerssandiego.org and check our bulletin board in the counseling center.

COMPACT FOR SUCCESS (CFS): For guaranteed admission to SDSU, you must meet all of the benchmarks: continuous enrollment in the district, 3.3 or higher CSU GPA, satisfy the English and Math requirement, take the SAT/ACT, and complete all the "a-g" courses with a "C" or higher. The CFS program does not apply to certain impacted majors.

CREDIT RECOVERY: If you received a D or F in an academic course at the semester, see your counselor for remediation options.

1) If you failed an academic class, you need to repeat that class for graduation 2) If you received a D and you are interested in attending a four-year university, you need to repeat that class. D's are not accepted at a four-year university.

PRINCIPAL'S HONOR ROLL: Students must have an overall weighted GPA over 7 semesters of a 3.75 (starting in 9th grade through first semester of 12th grade). Students must also take at least two Advanced Placement (AP) courses within their four years of high school. Further, students can only have one D or F in citizenship in seven semesters of High School. Students also must have at least 100 hours of community service completed.
