The GPAs listed on your transcripts are estimates.

COMPACT FOR SUCCESS: For guaranteed admission to SDSU, you must meet all of the benchmarks: continuous enrollment in the district, 3.0 or higher CSU GPA, satisfy the English and Math requirement, take the SAT/ACT, and complete all the "a-g" courses with a "C" or higher. The CFS program does not apply to certain impacted majors.

CREDIT RECOVERY: If you received a D or F in an academic course at the semester, see your counselor for remediation options.

The CFS program does not apply to nursing, dance, music performance and theater performance.
